The Clinical Psychology Program at the University of Arizona is jointly accredited by the American Psychological Association (APA) Commission on Accreditation and the Psychological Clinical Science Accreditation System (PCSAS). - Fit with Clinical Program faculty member(s) program of research
- Applicant's fit with our research-oriented, Psychological Clinical Science Program
- Letters of recommendation
- Quality of undergraduate training
- GPA
- Potential contribution to the educational environment (e.g., expertise, life experience and diverse points of view)
- Road students have traveled to get to this point in their career
- Demonstrated motivation, perseverance, and ability

Transfer Credits
 Students accepted into the Ph.D. program who have completed graduate level courses may be able to obtain credit for these courses, up to a maximum of 30 units, in the Ph.D. program. Details about requirements and limits on the number of courses that can be transferred are available from the UA Policy page and the Doctoral Policy page. Transfer courses that will be used to count in place of a program requirement must be deemed equivalent to courses currently offered in the Psychology department. In order to qualify as a transfer course, students should provide a list of previous courses alongside the course at the University of Arizona that is a program required course, and include a syllabus for each of these courses and provide this package to their advisor. The advisor will then reach out to each faculty member currently teaching the equivalent course for consideration. If the faculty member considers the coursework equivalent, then this confirmation should be forwarded to the Advisor, the Program Director, the Graduate Program Coordinator, and the Director of Graduate Studies. Transfer courses must be approved by the area Program Director and the 5 Director of Graduate Studies, and ultimately approval is up to the Graduate College. The Graduate Coordinator can provide students with more details on transfer courses. Courses taken before matriculating in the Ph.D. program can only be transferred during the first year of the graduate program.
